







Public Engagement Volunteers

Role	The Public Engagement Volunteers will enhance the visitor experience during visits to EZ through public engagement, activities, and crafts, by helping to ensure our visitors have an enjoyable and educational experience. This is done as they facilitate learning in a fun way and help spread the RZSS mission and vision.
Duties	 The main role of Public Engagement volunteers is to ensure visitors enjoy their time at Edinburgh Zoo: This is an outdoor active role, walking around the zoo to ensure visitors have a valuable experience. Volunteers will be placed at some animal exhibits, including walkthroughs, to chat to visitors and help them learn about the zoo as a conservation charity. Volunteers will be walking points of information and assist visitors with wayfinding at key areas around the zoo and pointing out the animals. Volunteers are encouraged to ask questions that are aimed to help visitors discover more about the exhibits, explore the trails around the zoo, and learn about the key conservation messages. Volunteers will deliver Public Engagement activities, and one-off value-added events. This may include discovery dens, assisting with Wild discoveries and Q&A's with guests after one of our Animal Discovery talks. Volunteers will run the discovery dens, a series of tables around the zoo to encourage the public to understand conservation issues through informal learning. This is done with biofacts, interpretation, and themed games. Though there is no direct contact with animals, volunteers may also help keepers in other ways, such as creating enrichment, animal observations, and window washing.

Excellent communication skills to help people build connections with nature. Interested in animals and conservation. Keen to learn and stay informed. Able to work outside and inside for long periods of activity.
Commitment	 We hope that volunteers will be able to commit to at least 60 hours a year. Volunteer shift times start at 10:30-12.30 or 13.30-16.30
